This will be elucidated mainly using the example of capitalism while an abundance of other issues taken up by the novel like climate change, democracy, racism or violence would certainly serve as productive foci of analysis as well. Capitalism will be the centre of attention because it is at the core of the apocalyptic circumstances portrayed in the novel. It also constitutes an intersection with most of the other issues named above. This paper will not delve deeper into other interesting aspects of the generation of utopian hope like narration.
